HELP WANTED... EXPLORATION SUMMER PROGRAMS

Instructor positions for current college sophomores and beyond!

The Exploration Junior Program is an independent, co-educational program on the campus of St. Mark's School in Southborough, MA for students entering grades four through seven. The Program provides academic enrichment, activities, athletics and trips for both residential and day students.

-The Linda K. Cotter Internship Award Competition - Awards are need based and applicants must have a current year financial aid application at Colby. January awards range from \$500-\$1500. Competition for January awards is open to all sophomores, juniors, and seniors. The application deadline for LKC funding for January 2008 is November 1, 2007.

-The David Strage '82 International Internship - This award provides a stipend of \$1,000 to defray the travel and/or living expenses of one Colby student each year pursuing an international internship. This is a competitive, merit-based award. Only one award will be given per year. The award is open to all majors. Internships may be completed in any professional career area and must be carried out in an international location. Priority will be given to applicants without previous international experience. The application deadline is November 1, 2007.

-The Medalie Family Entrepreneur Internship Fund - This fund provides a stipend of \$1,000 to defray the travel and/or living expenses of one Colby student each year pursuing an unpaid internship with an entrepreneur. This is a competitive, merit-based award. Only one award will be given per year. The award is open to all majors. Internships may be completed in any professional career area but must be with a small, entrepreneurial organization or an individual. The application deadline is November 1, 2007. Applicants may use the award either for January or for the summer.
