THE GOLDWATER FELLOWSHIP

The Goldwater Fellowship is one of the few fellowship opportunities for sophomores and juniors in the natural sciences and mathematics who intend to pursue graduate study. The fellowship provides \$7500 per year for the last one or two years of undergraduate education. The primary qualifications for the Goldwater are, "a demonstrated potential and commitment to a career in mathematics, the natural sciences, or engineering, and outstanding academic performance."

For those of you who may be interested in graduate fellowships--Rhodes, Marshall, Churchill, NSF--the Goldwater is an important stepping stone. Most finalists for the Churchill scholarship, for example, are also Goldwater scholars.

If you may be interested in pursuing a Goldwater fellowship, please come to an informational meeting on Tuesday the 27th (tomorrow) at 3:30pm in Lovejoy 303. This will be a quick (20 min) meeting where I'll describe the scholarship and give you some pointers about how to proceed.

The most important deadline is January 15th, 2008, which will be the internal Colby deadline for receipt of materials. Note that, since the fellowship requires references from faculty, you may want to line those up before the end of this semester.

MAINE MEDICAL CENTER RESEARCH INSTITUTE

The Summer Student Research Program (SSRP) at Maine Medical Center Research Institute offers college students a unique opportunity to conduct educational research in diverse biomedical science fields during the summer months. During the ten-week program, students attend a comprehensive course featuring topics including bioethics, animal use in biomedical science, and scientific presentation skill, and attend lectures presented by distinguished guest scientists and faculty members. GOOGLE POLICY FELLOWSHIP

As lawmakers around the world become more engaged on Internet policy, ensuring a robust and intelligent public debate around these issues becomes increasingly important. That's why Google has launched the Google Policy Fellowship Program-to support students and organizations working on policy issues fundamental to the future of the Internet and its users. Fellows will have the opportunity to work at public interest organizations at the forefront of debates on broadband and access policy, content regulation, copyright and trademark reform, consumer privacy, open government, and more. Seeking students who are passionate about technology, and want to spend the summer diving headfirst into Internet policy. Fellows will receive a stipend of \$7,000 for 10 weeks during the summer of 2008 (June-August). Exact dates of the fellowship will be worked out by the fellow and host organization.
