NOVEMBER 1 APPLICATION DEADLINE FOR INTERNSHIP FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

-The Linda K. Cotter Internship Award Competition - Awards are need based and applicants must have a current year financial aid application at Colby. January awards range from \$500-\$1500. Competition for January awards is open to all sophomores, juniors, and seniors.

-The David Strage '82 International Internship - This award provides a stipend of \$1,000 to defray the travel and/or living expenses of one Colby student each year pursuing an international internship. This is a competitive, merit-based award. Only one award will be given per year. The award is open to all majors. Internships may be completed in any professional career area and must be carried out in an international location. Priority will be given to applicants without previous international experience.

-The Medalie Family Entrepreneur Internship Fund - This fund provides a stipend of \$1,000 to defray the travel and/or living expenses of one Colby student each year pursuing an unpaid internship with an entrepreneur. This is a competitive, merit-based award. Only one award will be given per year. The award is open to all majors. Internships may be completed in any professional career area but must be with a small, entrepreneurial organization or an individual
